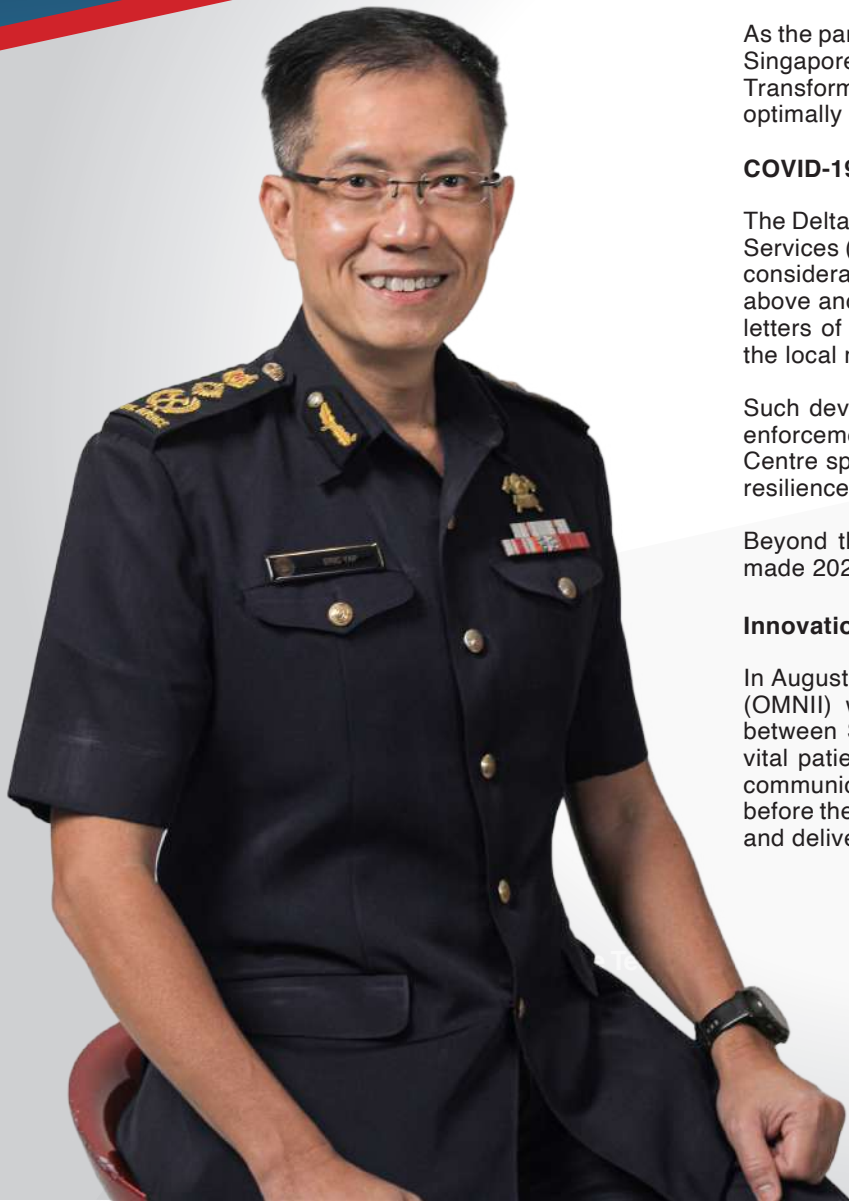

# COMMISSIONER'S FOREWORD



As the pandemic evolved through phases in 2021, presenting various challenges for the world including Singapore and SCDF, the Force remained steadfast in response and continued to keep focus on its Transformation 2025's vision of building *A Nation of Lifesavers* where science and technology are optimally leveraged in training and emergency response.

## COVID-19 Efforts

The Delta and Omicron variants led to unprecedented surges in the demand for our Emergency Medical Services (EMS). This added significant stress on our EMS personnel who were already operating under considerable pressure from the difficult circumstances. Despite this, our dedicated EMS officers went above and beyond to serve the community to the best of their abilities, as evidenced by the numerous letters of compliments we received from members of the public, including forum letters published in the local media.

Such devotion and endeavours were also undertaken by many SCDF staff, including our fire safety enforcement officers in ensuring a fire safe Singapore amidst the pandemic and our 995 Operations Centre specialists who had managed over 300,000 calls in 2021, a true demonstration of the grit and resilience of SCDF officers.

Beyond the pandemic related efforts, there were several key events, activities, and initiatives that made 2021 particularly significant for SCDF.

## Innovation and Technology

In August 2021, after years of development, the Operational Medical Networks Informatics Integrator (OMNII) was implemented. This first-of-its-kind digital system enables real-time information flow between SCDF and hospitals, which leads to better patient outcomes. Our paramedics can receive vital patient information even before arriving at the scene, and critical medical interventions can be communicated by the paramedics to the hospital so that the necessary resources can be prepared before the patient's arrival at the hospital. OMNII has essentially revolutionised the way SCDF responds and delivers its pre-hospital emergency care to the public.

On the operations capability front, our 20-year-old fleet of command vehicles were replaced by the next-generation models of the Forward Command Vehicle (FCV) and Command Vehicle (CV). The new fleet comes equipped with state-of-the-art Command, Control, Communications, Computers, and Information Technology (C4IT) systems and a slew of sense-making tools to enhance the overall quality of incident management during major large-scale emergencies. Human factors engineering was also integrated into the design to optimise conditions for prolonged deployments and to minimise operational fatigue.

Punggol Fire Station was operationalised in December 2021 as SCDF's first smart fire station. Several new technologies - such as facial recognition, automated entry/exit access control, automated medical store, and virtual reality/extended reality training system, etc. – were incorporated into the station's infrastructure and in the areas of operations, training, and community engagement. Such smart capabilities will serve as a blueprint to be rolled out to all other fire stations as we strive to be more efficient and effective in carrying out our mission of protecting and saving lives and property.

### International Engagement

On the international front, despite the pandemic related travel restrictions, we held successful chairmanships of the ASEAN Ministerial Meeting on Disaster Management (AMMDM) and ASEAN Committee on Disaster Management (ACDM) in 2021. We are especially proud of having launched the ASEAN Agreement on Disaster Management and Emergency Response (AADMER) Work Programme (2021–2025), which will bolster the region's disaster management capabilities through new partnerships, capacity building initiatives, and innovation.

We continued our humanitarian efforts as co-chair of the United Nation's International Search and Rescue Advisory Group (INSARAG) Guidelines Review Group (2018-2020) by conducting a workshop on the INSARAG Guidelines 2020. Singapore, with support from the United Nations Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (UNOCHA), co-authored the latest version of the guidelines and conducted a virtual technical webinar for a global audience. We look forward to forging stronger partnerships with the INSARAG network, and we stand ready to contribute to the international humanitarian scene when called upon.

### Organisational Excellence

We also achieved numerous milestones in organisational development last year. One of them was the signing of a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) between SCDF, Singapore Armed Forces (SAF), and Nanyang Polytechnic (NYP) in May 2021. Through the MoU, the professional development of our paramedics is structured around a diploma and an intensive on-the-job training programme. This would translate to higher standards of care in EMS to meet emerging challenges such as an ageing population with possibly multiple chronic conditions.

Another milestone was the conferring of several awards for our Responders' Performance Vehicle (RPV), the world's first fully integrated onsite rehabilitation facility for emergency responders. The project clinched the Home Team Achievement Award, the highest accolade in the innovation category at the Minister's Awards Presentation Ceremony held in October 2021.



It was also conferred the Institution of Engineers, Singapore (IES) Prestigious Engineering Achievement Award at the World Engineers Summit (WES) Conference held in November 2021. These awards are testament to SCDF's exceptional innovation and cross-sectoral collaboration in creating cutting-edge solutions for our dynamic and evolving frontline operations. On a pro-business front, SCDF was among the five government agencies conferred the Pro-Enterprise Survey Recognition Award at the Pro-Enterprise Panel–Singapore Business Federation (PEP-SBF) Awards Ceremony in November 2021.

This continues to be a validation of our pro-enterprise journey in creating a more conducive pro-business environment without compromising on fire safety. This is achieved through close partnerships with private enterprises and professional bodies in reviewing and streamlining rules and processes.

### Community Emergency Preparedness

Despite the pandemic, we made significant progress in our journey towards our Transformation 2025's vision of building *A Nation of Lifesavers*. We crossed the 100,000 mark in registered Community First Responders (CFRs) on our myResponder app, a testimony to the unwavering efforts of our CFR ambassadors and strong public support. More importantly, in 2021, CFRs responded to 45% of all cases activated on the myResponder app, and this response rate has been increasing steadily over the years. And since the launch of the myResponder app in 2015, more than 40 cardiac arrest patients have been revived by the timely actions of CFRs.

In August 2021, we launched the third expansion of the AED-on-Wheels programme with ComfortDelGro taxis. And earlier this year, we heralded another milestone in the programme by expanding beyond the commercial sector to engage private citizens. Today, 50 private citizen CFRs have their vehicles equipped with AEDs and can be alerted to nearby cardiac arrest emergencies via the myResponder app. These initiatives are truly a force multiplier to our collective lifesaving mission.

## Forging Ahead in 2022

2022 looks set to be another year filled with many more exciting developments and initiatives which we can look forward to and to emerge much stronger, as a Force, from the pandemic.

In the domain of training, we have just completed Phase 1 of the redevelopment of our Civil Defence Academy (CDA), and with it, the operationalisation of the Emergency Responders' Fitness Conditioning Enhancement Lab (ExCEL). It houses five key facilities, each harnessing different technologies and taking a science-based approach to augment and optimise our responders' operational performance. ExCEL's true potential is envisioned to be realised through collaborative research and innovation in emergency responder performance in the years to come. We are now in the midst of Phase 2 of CDA's redevelopment. When completed in early 2023, training in SCDF will be raised to a new level with a slew of modern facilities and technologies such as the National EMS Training Centre, a host of new 'live' training simulators, and a Fire Research Centre. This year also marks a milestone for SCDF's Marine Division as it celebrates its 10th year of operations.

The unit has grown from strength to strength in the past decade through an intense programme of capability and capacity expansion. The next lap will see the leveraging of advanced technologies, such as Unmanned Surface Vessels and Unmanned Aerial Vehicles, to augment the operations.

Speaking of robotics, our frontline officers can also look forward to operating alongside more robots at the ground, with the progressive deployment of the Pumper Firefighting Machines and Red Rhino Robots (3Rs) to all fire stations. In particular, the 3Rs will augment the 3-crew section on board the latest 6th generation Light Fire Attack Vehicles (LFAV) that will be introduced into operation this year.

Besides the technological prowess of *The Life Saving Force*, we will continue to invest in and develop our people, our greatest asset. To this end, we are scaling up the capabilities of our Operationally Ready National Service (ORNS) urban search and rescue units - the Rescue Units and Medical Units, to perform search and rescue operations to the recommended medium standards recommended by the UN INSARAG. We aim to attain the INSARAG Recognised National Accreditation Process (IRNAP) status by end 2022, which will see Singapore as the first Asia-Pacific country to do so.

Finally, we are working towards implementing the next phase of our EMS tiered response framework to better manage the increasing demand. This will be in the form of a non-dispatch ambulance policy for calls assessed to be non-emergencies by our 995 call-takers. This will ensure that our resources are used only for emergencies as committing them to non-emergency cases will deprive those in need of EMS, especially life-threatening cases. The non-dispatch ambulance policy is expected to be rolled out in early 2023.

In all our endeavours, a key factor of success is the support of our partners such as Home Team departments, related agencies, and the community. We remain immensely grateful for their support and encouragement. Thank you for being part of our lifesaving mission and I wish everyone good health and fortitude to weather these challenging times.

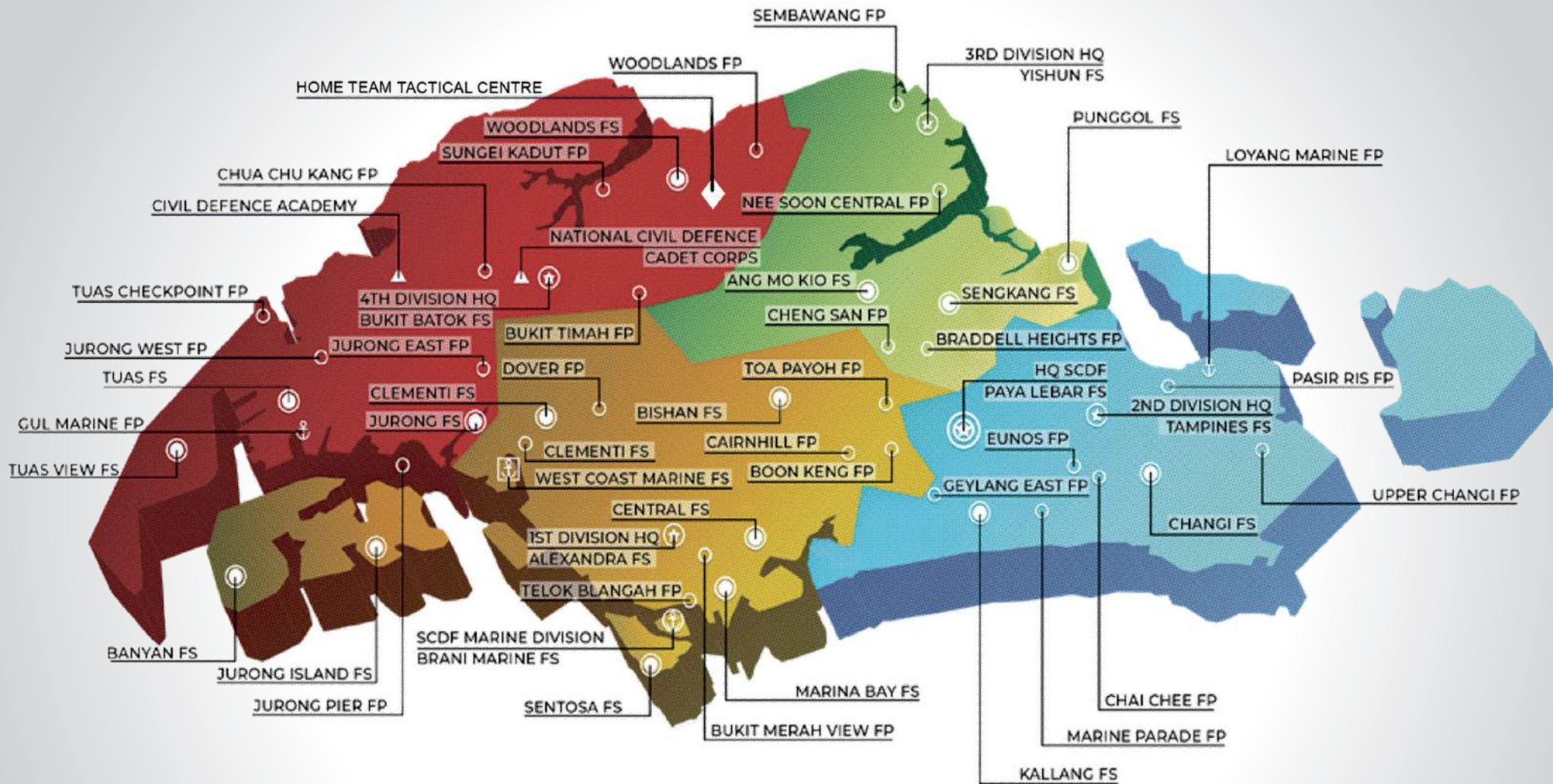

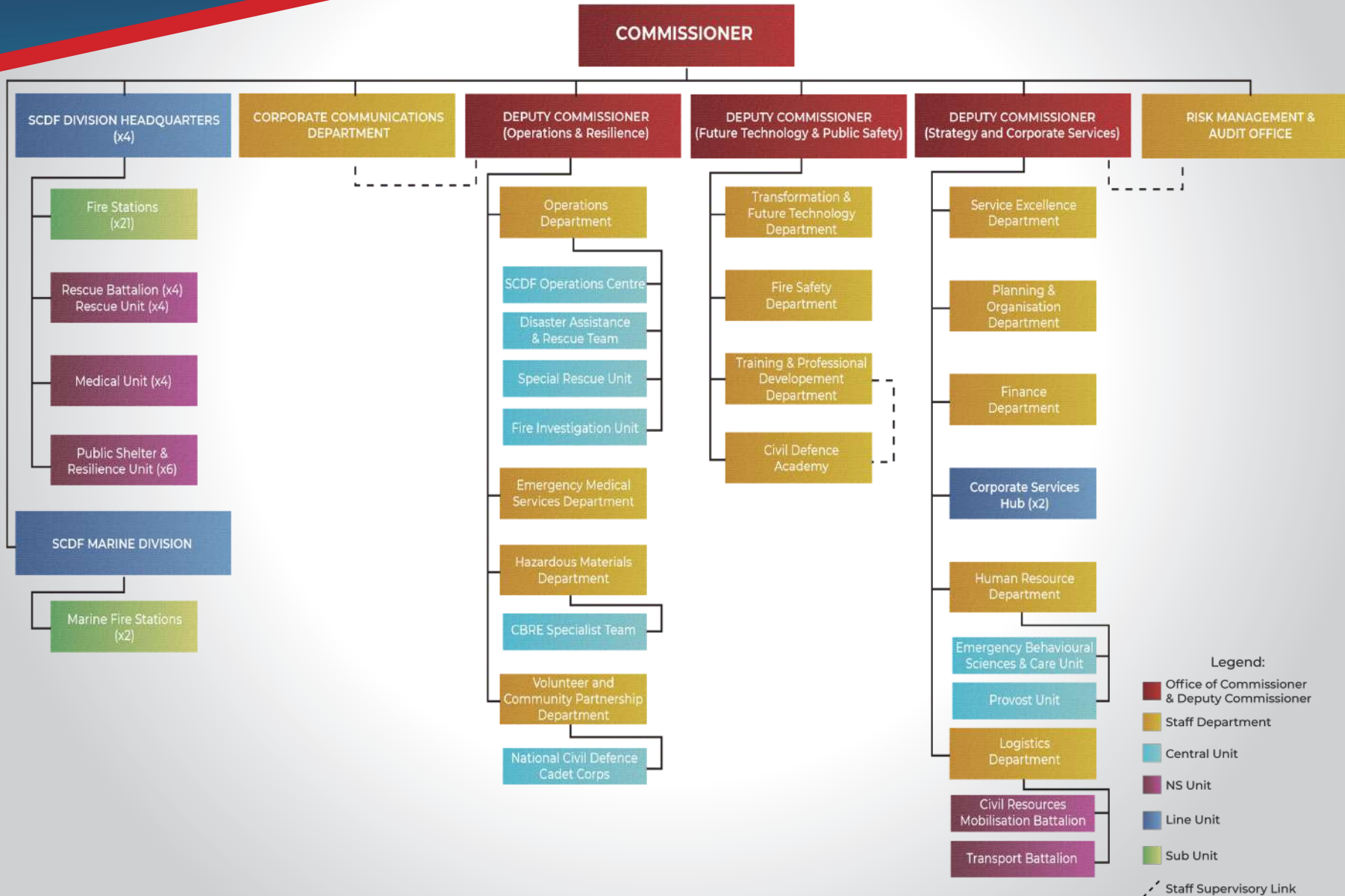

# NEXT GENERATION COMMAND VEHICLES

On 15 April 2021, SCDF unveiled its next-generation of the Forward Command Vehicle and Command Vehicle. These are mobile command posts deployed by HQ SCDF and the HQ Land Divisions respectively during major incidents to facilitate command and control of the operation. Jointly developed by the Defence Science and Technology Agency (DSTA), Home Team Science and Technology Agency (HTX) and ST Engineering, the vehicles are equipped with state-of-the-art Command, Control, Communications, Computers, and Information Technology (C4IT).

Each vehicle comes with on-site planning and operations workstations, a video wall to enhance commanders' situational awareness and integrates human factors engineering for prolonged deployment and to minimise operational fatigue.

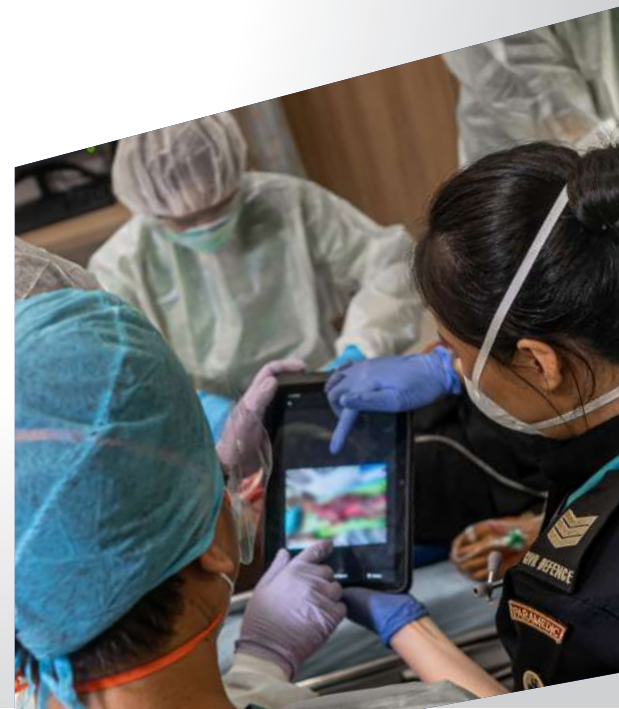

# OPERATIONAL MEDICAL NETWORKS INFORMATICS INTEGRATOR (OMNII)

Operational Medical Networks Informatics Integrator (OMNII) is Singapore’s first Pre-hospital Emergency Care digital project between SCDF and the Ministry of Health (MOH). Implemented on 26 August 2021, it enables authorised stakeholders such as staff from the SCDF 995 Operations Centre, SCDF Emergency Medical Services and hospitals’ Emergency Departments (EDs) to view, share and document relevant patient data seamlessly to improve patient care management.

Upon SCDF’s incident dispatch, the patient’s medical history from the National Electronic Health Record system will be pushed automatically to the OMNII app to guide the paramedic’s clinical and operational decision-making. While en-route to the hospital, real-time data of the patient’s vital signs and incident photographs can be transmitted seamlessly to the hospital so that the ED can pre-register the patient and prepare the necessary resources for treatment, thus saving invaluable time.

# SINGAPORE'S FIRST SMART FIRE STATION

Punggol Fire Station, operational since 30 December 2021, is Singapore's first Smart Fire Station, where state-of-the-art technologies are integrated into its infrastructure, training and community engagement facilities.

For instance, the station is installed with automated access controls using CCTV analytics such as facial recognition, motion sensing and licence plate reading. Its classroom is not only equipped with interactive digital screens with live-streaming capabilities but also Virtual Reality and Extended Reality technologies, allowing for enhanced training realism, safety and flexibility.

Punggol Fire Station has the largest green landscape area among all SCDF's fire stations with nine gardens spanning 2,500 sq/m, enabling it to earn the Building and Construction Authority Green Mark Gold Award in 2020.

In December last year, it became the first fire station in SCDF to launch its Facebook page, to create localised trust bubbles by directly connecting and engaging with the community it serves.

# HEIGHT RESCUE OPERATION @ CONSTRUCTION SITE ALONG BEACH ROAD

On 12 April 2021, firefighters and specialists from the elite Disaster Assistance and Rescue Team (DART) were deployed for a height rescue operation on a tower crane at a construction site along Beach Road. A worker who was on the 55 metres landing platform of the crane felt giddy and was unable to climb down to safety.

A team of firefighters ascended a cat ladder to assess the worker while the DART specialists set up various anchoring points to establish a lowering system. Ultimately, the worker was safely lowered to the ground, treated by the paramedics and conveyed to hospital.

# HEIGHT RESCUE OPERATION @ JURONG PORT

On 10 June 2021, a man was found in a cargo hold approximately 15 metres below the deck of a berthed vessel. The man who had a head injury and fractured lower limbs was medically stabilised by the paramedics.

Thereafter, firefighters and DART specialists worked together with the Company Emergency Response Team (CERT) personnel to carefully secure the man onto a stretcher and brought him out of the cargo hold by means of a hoisting system. An SCDF ambulance subsequently conveyed him to the hospital.

# SHOPHOUSE FIRE @ TEO HONG ROAD

On 15 June 2021, a shophouse at Teo Hong Road was ablaze. The fire at the ceiling on the third floor and the attic of the shophouse was extinguished with three water jets. A Combined Platform Ladder was also deployed for aerial firefighting operations.

Occupants from the shophouse had self-evacuated prior to SCDF's arrival. About 20 other occupants from the neighbouring units were evacuated by SCDF as a precautionary measure.

# ROAD TRAFFIC ACCIDENT @ BUKIT BATOK CENTRAL

On 11 July 2021, a passenger bus was lying on its side at Bukit Batok Central. Eight persons were found within the bus while another nine were outside. The rear windscreen of the bus which had shattered served as an entry point for SCDF rescuers. The rescuers created an additional point of entry at the front of the bus by using an electrical saw to cut through the front windscreen.

SCDF's Emergency Medical Services (EMS) personnel assessed a total of 17 persons, 14 of whom sustained injuries and were conveyed to hospitals by SCDF ambulances.

# FIRE @ GEYLANG BAHRU

On 28 July 2021, a fire was well-alight on the second floor of a two-storey premises at Geylang Bahru. Firefighters immediately deployed water jets to surround the exterior of the burning premises to prevent the fire from spreading. Simultaneously, firefighters donned breathing apparatus sets and proceeded to the second floor to combat the raging fire.

SCDF deployed a total of 11 emergency vehicles and about 40 firefighters to the incident. At the height of the operation, four water jets were utilised and the fire was extinguished in about an hour.

# FIRE @ TAMPINES STREET 81

On 7 August 2021, a coffee shop at Tampines Street 81 was ablaze. Armed with water jets, firefighters with their breathing apparatus sets proceeded cautiously into the burning coffee shop to conduct firefighting operations.

The fire was extinguished with four water jets within an hour. Stall owners and patrons of the coffee shop as well as members of the public in the immediate vicinity had self-evacuated prior to SCDF's arrival. There were no reported injuries.

SCDF presented Community First Responder Awards to three members of the public for their prompt and exemplary actions in using hosereels to fight the fire before SCDF's arrival.

# FIRE @ PULAU BUKOM KECHIL

On 17 September 2021, a fire occurred in a pump room at an offshore island of Pulau Bukom Kechil. The in-house Company Emergency Response Team (CERT) immediately applied foam jets at the fire while SCDF emergency vehicles were being ferried over on a barge from Pasir Panjang Ferry Terminal. A Heavy Rescue Vessel from SCDF's Brani Marine Fire Station was also deployed to transport SCDF firefighters to the island.

SCDF emergency responders worked hand in hand with the CERT to successfully extinguish the fire. Four CERT members suffered minor heat-related injuries and received first-aid treatment.

# INDUSTRIAL FIRE @ GEYLANG BAHRU

On 7 October 2021, a fire was well-alight in two ground floor units of a double-storey industrial premises at Geylang Bahru. Firefighters immediately deployed water jets around the exterior of the premises while forcible entry was simultaneously conducted to create quick access into the burning units. Firefighters had to exercise extreme caution throughout the operation as the second-floor mezzanine level had already collapsed.

The fire was extinguished in about two hours. SCDF deployed 17 emergency vehicles and about 60 firefighters to the incident. At the height of the firefighting operation, four water jets and an Unmanned Firefighting Machine were deployed.

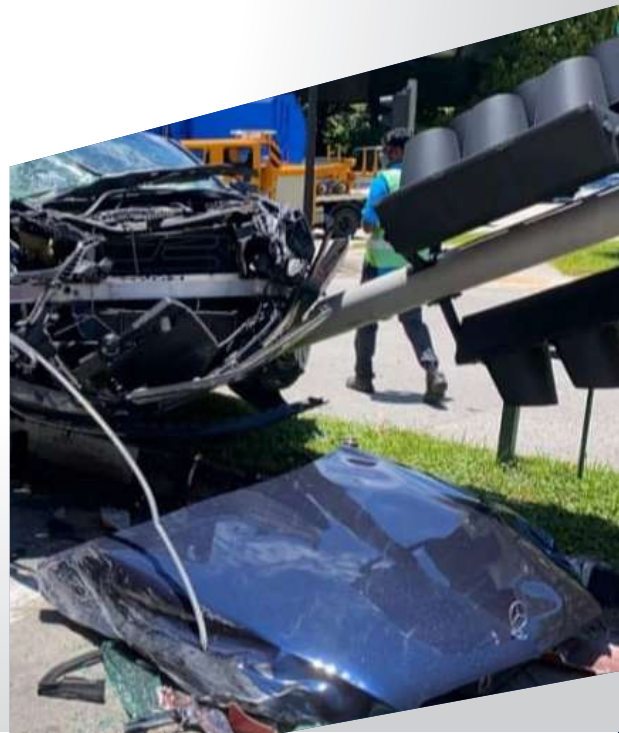

# ROAD TRAFFIC ACCIDENT @ JUNCTION OF JALAN AHMAD IBRAHIM AND BENOI ROAD

On 11 October 2021, a massive road traffic accident occurred at the junction of Jalan Ahmad Ibrahim and Benoi Road. It involved five vehicles, including a trailer truck and lorry.

A man was trapped in the driver's seat of a car which had toppled a traffic light pole. Due to the car's precarious position, firefighters had to first stabilise it to minimise its movement during the intricate rescue operation so as not to aggravate the condition of the trapped driver. Thereafter, firefighters used hydraulic rescue equipment to extricate the trapped man. He and two passengers from the same car were conveyed by SCDF ambulances to the hospital.

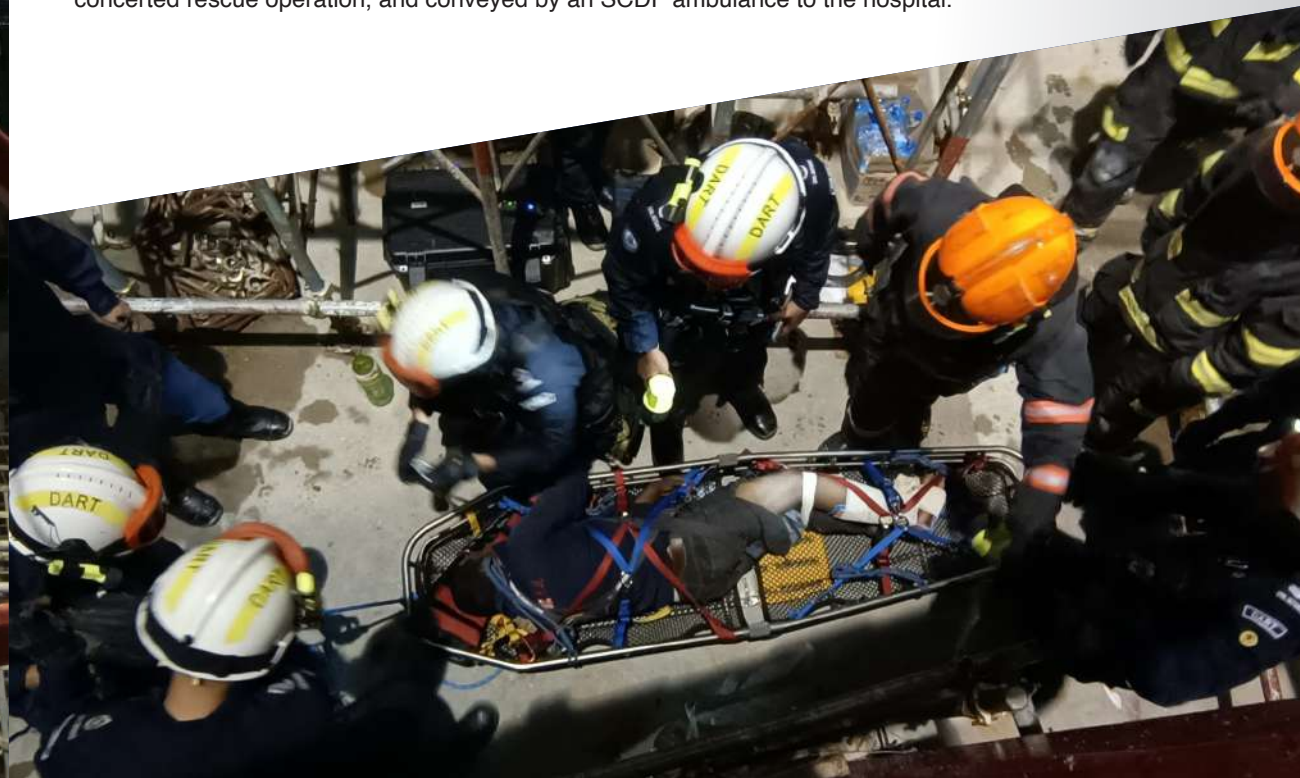

# HEIGHT RESCUE OPERATION @ CONSTRUCTION SITE ALONG BEACH ROAD

On 12 November 2021, firefighters and DART specialists were activated for a height rescue operation on a tower crane at a construction site along Beach Road. A man who was working 70 meters up on the tower crane had injured his leg.

Two SCDF firefighters, one of whom was cross-trained as an Emergency Medical Technician (EMT), climbed up a cat ladder to reach the injured man. Suspecting that he had broken his leg, the firefighters bandaged and immobilised the injured leg. Two DART specialists then climbed up the crane and set up a height lowering system involving ropes and pulleys while another team of DART specialists awaited on the ground to receive the injured man. The man was safely lowered to the ground by a well-coordinated and concerted rescue operation, and conveyed by an SCDF ambulance to the hospital.

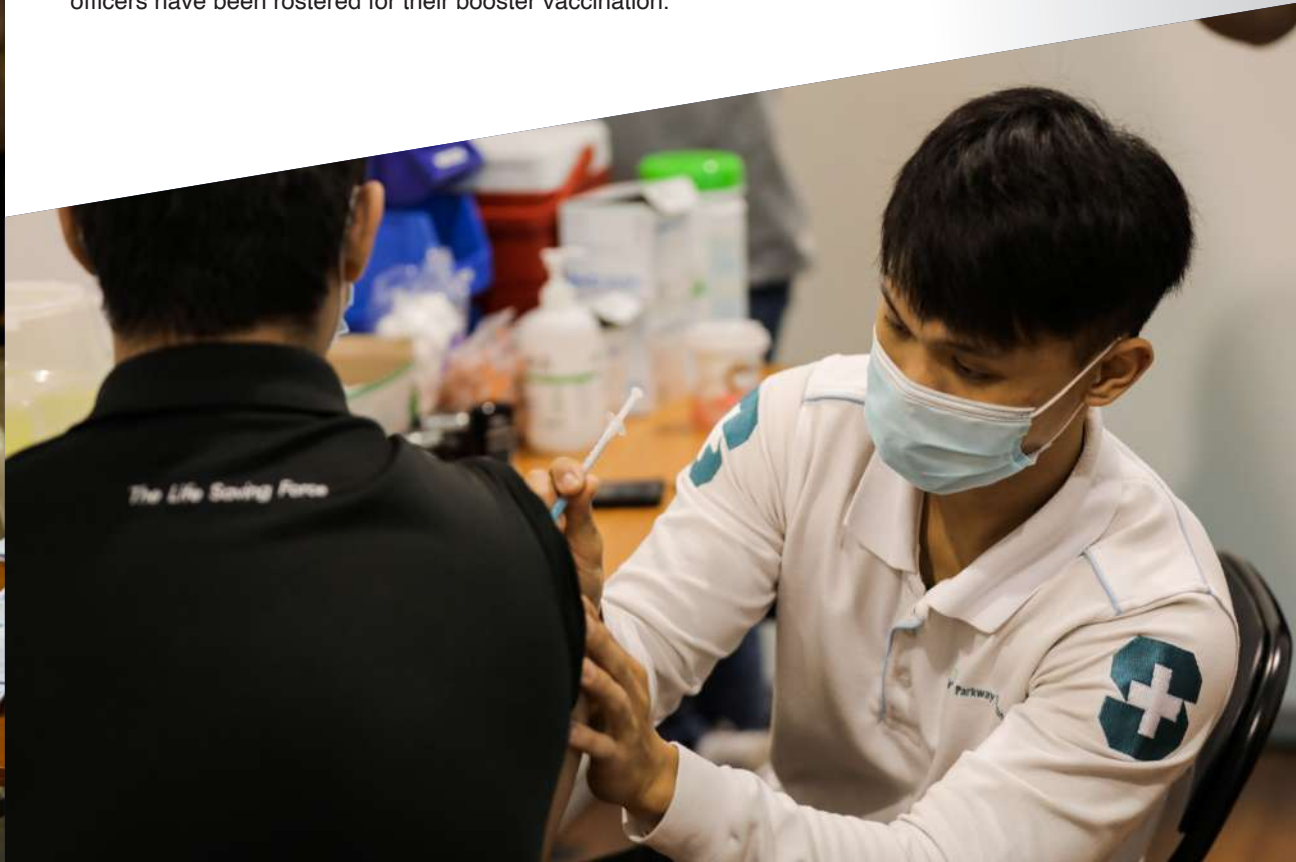




# COVID-19 VACCINATION EXERCISE

From January to February 2021, the SCDF Temporary Medical Centre vaccinated about 1,200 paramedics and Emergency Medical Technicians (EMTs). From March to September 2021, SCDF coordinated with Ministry of Health (MOH) to organise a series of vaccination exercises for the remaining workforce, where up to 6,000 officers were vaccinated at various MOH Vaccination Centres. The MOH Mobile Vaccination Team had also arranged vaccination for the trainees at the Civil Defence Academy (CDA) in May and June 2021.

As of March 2022, 100% of the SCDF's eligible workforce have been vaccinated and the majority of our officers have been rostered for their booster vaccination.

# OUTSOURCING OF FIRE SAFETY ENFORCEMENT CHECKS

On 3 May 2021, SCDF outsourced its straight forward fire safety enforcement checks to a third-party provider, a consortium from Singapore First Aid Training Centre Pte Ltd and ERCM Consultancy Pte Ltd. This allows SCDF officers to focus on more complex enforcement checks that require a higher level of fire safety knowledge and expertise. Operators from the consortium are appointed as Supplementary Enforcement Officers (SEOs) under the Fire Safety Act 1993.

Newly appointed SEOs must undergo a 2-week training course and pass an assessment administered by SCDF. Each SEO is issued with an authority card from SCDF and wears a vest with the words “*SCDF Enforcement*” on the back and the SEO company logo on the front. The SEOs are also equipped with body-worn cameras which, among others, serve as a performance review on their fire safety enforcement work. They have conducted an average of 160 fire safety enforcement checks per month.

# REVIEW OF FIRE SAFETY REQUIREMENTS FOR FARM BUILDINGS

To address food security, Singapore is increasing its local food produce from 10% to about 30% of its nutritional needs by 2030. In view of this, there is a need for a whole-of-government effort to support the growth of new farming industry such as its infrastructural development.

Previously, farm buildings were categorised as a 'Factory' in the Fire Code. The fire safety requirements for factories are generally deemed more onerous compared to other types of premises. In support of this national initiative and in being pro-enterprise, SCDF reviewed and calibrated the fire safety requirements for such farm buildings in accordance with their lower associated fire safety risks, thus lowering their construction costs. The revised requirements have been issued to the building industry via a circular in December 2020.

# PUBLICITY CAMPAIGN ON ‘CALLING 995 FOR EMERGENCIES ONLY’

SCDF continued its sustained publicity drive to generate and reinforce public awareness on what constitutes emergency and non-emergency medical cases, and the available courses of action to take for a non-emergency case. The publicity campaign was conducted from September 2021 to January 2022 and involved integrated marketing communications platforms such as radio, print, outdoor advertisements and digital media (YouTube, FB, IG and TikTok).

The main thrust of the campaign was SCDF partnering with professional content creators namely SGAG and King Kong Media Production (KKMP), to produce two long form game show videos. They were hosted by Annette Lee, a popular content creator with a handful of popular local celebrities as participants. # AED-ON-WHEELS PROGRAMME



The SCDF-ComfortDelGro AED-on-Wheels programme was officially launched on 26 August 2021 by Associate Professor Muhammad Faishal Ibrahim, Minister of State (MOS) for Ministry of Home Affairs and Ministry of National Development. This is the third expansion of the SCDF's AED-on-Wheels programme, a programme that equips vehicles on the move primarily with a first aid kit and an Automated External Defibrillator (AED) for cardiac arrest victims. ComfortDelGro drivers, trained by SCDF in basic life-saving skills, will be alerted via SCDF's myResponder mobile app to nearby cardiac arrest emergencies. Their prompt response will increase the chances of survival for someone who suffers a cardiac arrest.

A further enhancement of the AED-on-Wheels programme was launched in conjunction with the opening of Punggol Fire Station on 25 February 2022 by SM Teo Chee Hean, Senior Minister & Coordinating Minister for National Security. This enhancement marked the programme's first expansion beyond the commercial sector to engage private citizens to improve Out-of-Hospital cardiac arrest survivability rates. 150 private citizen Community First Responders have applied to have their vehicles equipped with AEDs and be alerted via the myResponder app to nearby cardiac arrest emergencies.

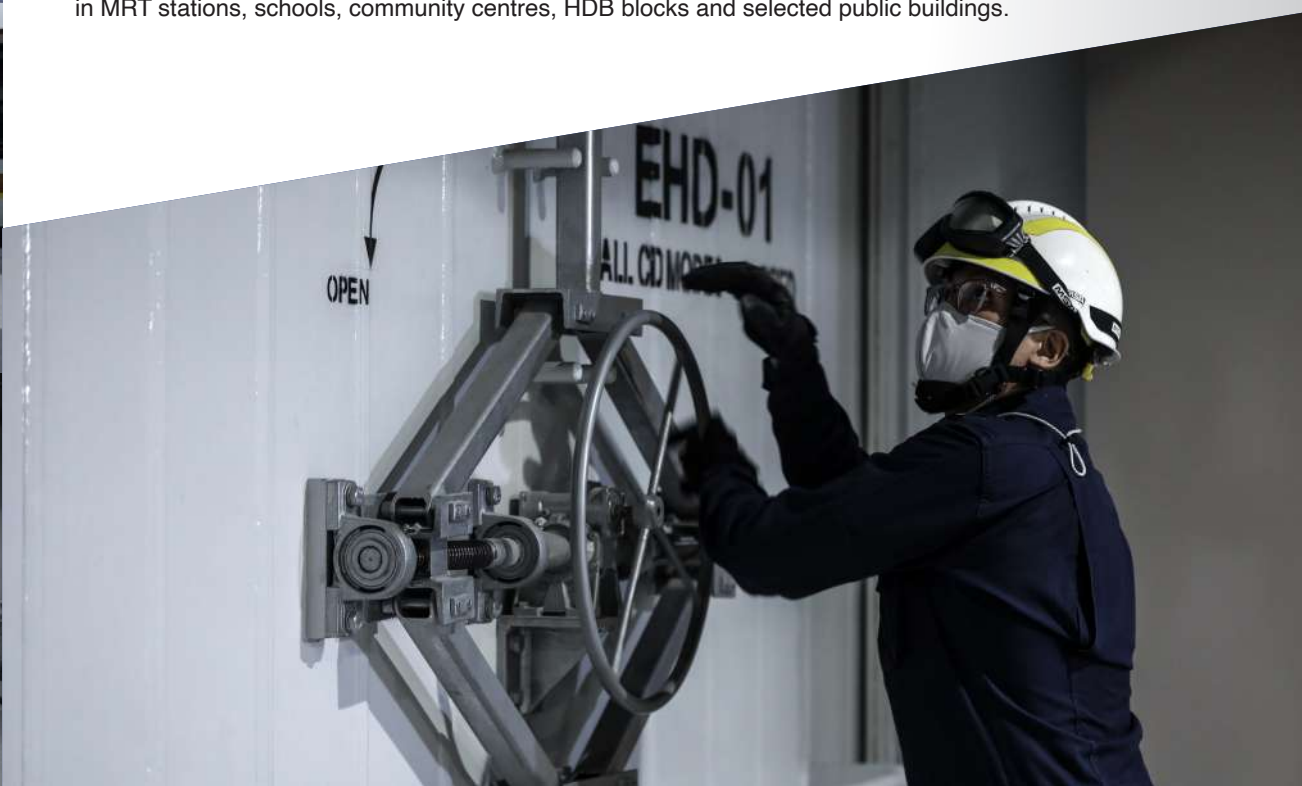


# THREE NEW MRT STATIONS TO SERVE AS EMERGENCY SHELTERS



With the opening of Thomson-East Coast Line (TEL) Stage 2 on 28 August 2021, three MRT Civil Defence (CD) shelters, namely Lentor, Mayflower and Bright Hill, were added to the existing island-wide network of public shelters. These latest generation MRT CD shelters are equipped with a new chemical protection strategy, which includes the Infiltration Protection Mode (IPM) and dry decontamination concepts. The IPM works by limiting the infiltration and exchange of any harmful external air into the shelter during a chemical agent release incident. The dry decontamination concept, on the other hand, allows a large group of people to be swiftly decontaminated without using water.

With the addition of the three new MRT CD shelters, there are now a total of 584 public CD shelters built in MRT stations, schools, community centres, HDB blocks and selected public buildings.

# PUBLIC LIABILITY INSURANCE COVERAGE FOR COMMUNITY FIRST RESPONDERS

By end October 2021, about 100,000 members of the public (MoPs) have registered on SCDF's myResponder app, which alerts them to nearby victims of cardiac arrest cases or minor fire incidents. In championing this noble life-saving cause and to encourage more MoPs to participate as Community First Responders (CFRs), SCDF has introduced an insurance coverage plan for CFRs on 25 August 2021.

This insurance covers for any third-party liability claim against mishaps that may inadvertently occur during a CFR's response to the myResponder alerts (e.g. accidental injury or property damage caused by them to a third party). This is over and above the existing Group Personal Accident (GPA) insurance coverage which covers the medical injuries sustained by the CFRs during their response to the myResponder alerts.

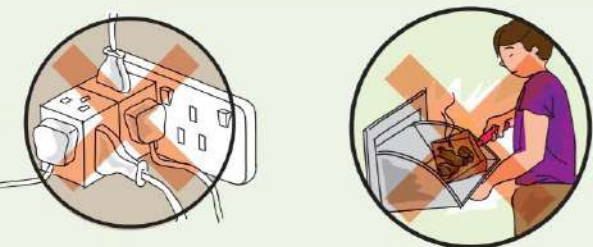
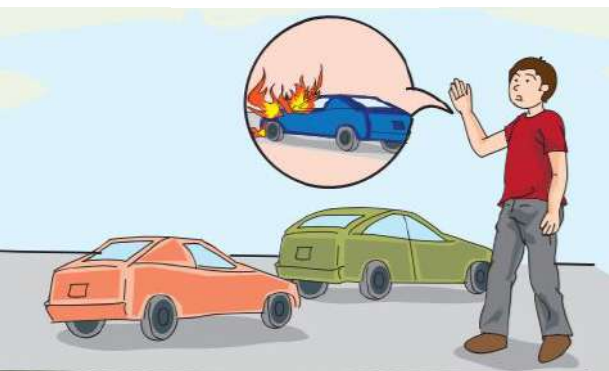

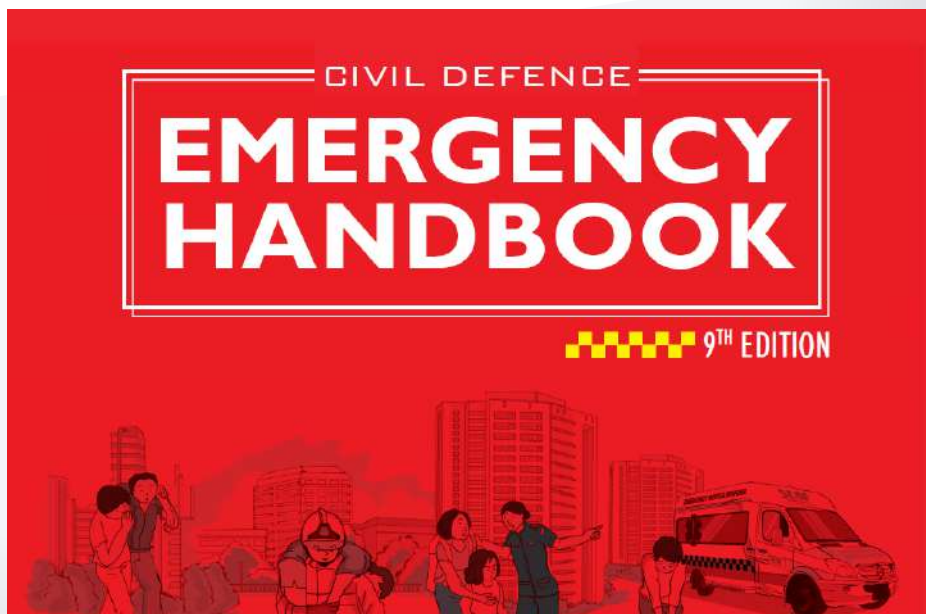


# CIVIL DEFENCE EMERGENCY HANDBOOK (9TH EDITION)



On 11 February 2022, SCDF launched the 9th edition of the Civil Defence Emergency Handbook (CDEH). The latest CDEH incorporates developments that were implemented in recent years such as the Save-A-Life Initiative which aims to make AED more accessible to the public. The handbook also features several life saving tips, with accompanying infographics, such as on how to perform “hands-only CPR” without mouth-to-mouth ventilation.

In the light of COVID-19, the CDEH carries an advisory on the use of surgical/face masks when responding to cardiac arrest cases as well as an update on the inclusion of healthcare supplies like spare surgical/face masks and sanitisers in the Ready Bag. Other key updates include fire safety tips to prevent battery fires, and fire safety advisory on piped town gas, electric vehicle and solar panel.

# REDEVELOPMENT OF CIVIL DEFENCE ACADEMY FIELD TRAINING AREA



The Civil Defence Academy Field Training Area is undergoing transformative redevelopment in three phases. The completion of Phase 1 in April 2021 saw the operationalising of the Emergency Responders Fitness Conditioning and Enhancement Lab (ExCEL), which is the first of its kind in the global firefighting fraternity and serves to enhance the physical and mental performance of our responders to maximise the potential of every individual.

ExCEL houses five key facilities. For example, the Strength, Conditioning and Rehabilitation in a Virtual Environment (STRiVE) facility combines both physical training via its motion platform treadmill and cognitive training via its high definition 360-degree dome, which together gamify training in a highly engaging and immersive environment. The Digital Learning Lab (DLL) employs the use of cutting-edge virtual reality (VR), augmented reality (AR) and mixed reality (MR) applications to further enhance training and learning outcomes.

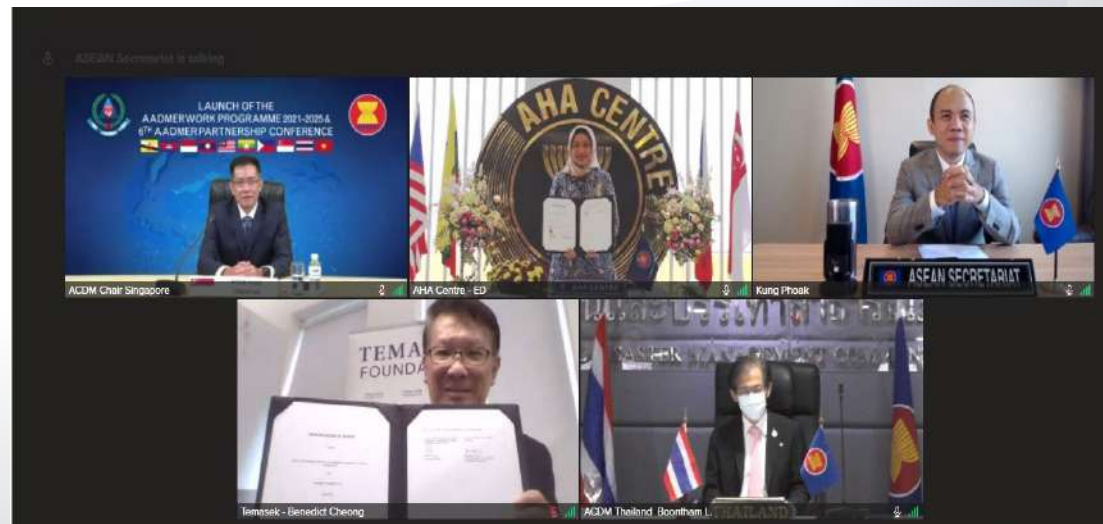

# INSARAG GUIDELINES WORKSHOP FOR ASIA PACIFIC REGION

As the co-chair of the International Search and Rescue Advisory Group (INSARAG) Guidelines Review Group 2018 – 2020, SCDF conducted a virtual workshop on the INSARAG Guidelines 2020 for the Asia Pacific region on 28 June 2021. The workshop was supported by the United Nations Office for the Coordination of Humanitarian Affairs (UNOCHA) and attended by about 100 participants.

The INSARAG Guidelines is a set of internationally accepted documents that outlines the methodology for countries to develop their national Urban Search and Rescue (USAR) response capability to mitigate the impact arising from a sudden onset of disaster causing large-scale structural collapse, as well as the requirements and standards for international USAR teams to respond to affected countries. The INSARAG Guidelines Review Group 2018 – 2020 was co-chaired by Singapore and Switzerland. SCDF looks forward to forging strong partnerships with the network and stands ready to contribute to the international scene, when required.

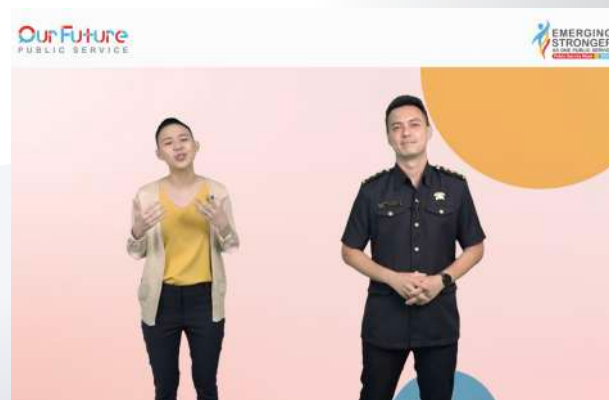


# ONE PUBLIC SERVICE OBSERVANCE CEREMONY

Staff well-being has always been a priority for SCDF, more so now during the pandemic where morale sensing operations are intensified to gather SCDF officers' feedback and sentiments on their readiness and confidence to perform their duties. These provided leaders with continual insights on how they can improve officers' mental health and morale.

For instance, resilience messages in the form of info-graphics have been disseminated frequently to all SCDF officers via email and messaging platforms (e.g. Telegram). Words of affirmation and support from SCDF leaders and commanders were broadcast through the *Leadership Resilience* series, and best practices in promoting positive team dynamics and managing staff's mental well-being were broadcast through the *Conversations with Leaders* series.

In addition, well-being calls were made to support officers who were placed on quarantine or tested positive for COVID-19. Through the CDtv internal broadcasts, staff were also constantly reminded to take actions to care for themselves, to look out for one another and create a supportive environment for the people around them.

# ASEAN STRATEGIC POLICY DIALOGUE ON DISASTER MANAGEMENT

Since 2015, the ASEAN Strategic Policy Dialogue on Disaster Management (SPDDM) has been providing a platform to sharpen ASEAN's disaster management policies and formulate long-term strategies. The annual SPDDM is co-organised by SCDF, the ASEAN Secretariat and the ASEAN Coordinating Centre for Humanitarian Assistance on Disaster Management (AHA Centre), supported by the Nanyang Technological University S. Rajaratnam School of International Studies (RSIS).

The theme of last year's virtual SPDDM was "*Advancing Disaster Management: Into a Future of Possibilities*", held from 24 to 26 August 2021. The panel discussed three key topics, namely strengthening local responses, innovative financing for disaster management, and leveraging technology and innovation. These topics are important in ensuring that ASEAN's disaster management response is future-ready and can deal with emerging challenges, especially against the backdrop of COVID-19.

# ASEAN COMMITTEE ON DISASTER MANAGEMENT

As the Chair of the ASEAN Ministerial Meeting on Disaster Management (AMMDM) and ASEAN Committee on Disaster Management (ACDM) last year, Singapore led by SCDF hosted a series of meetings from 8 to 14 October 2021. The meetings included the 9th AMMDM, 1st AMMDM Plus China, 1st AMMDM Plus Japan and 10th Conference of Parties (COP) to the ASEAN Agreement on Disaster Management and Emergency Response (AADMER), the 39th Meeting of the ACDM and other related meetings.

The 9th AMMDM was held in conjunction with the Commemoration of ASEAN Day for Disaster Management (ADDM). The ADDM is convened annually to raise awareness and remind the public of the importance of disaster risk reduction and marked the launch of new ASEAN initiatives in disaster management. In his opening remarks, Mr K Shanmugam, Minister for Home Affairs and Minister for Law, commended the ACDM and the ASEAN Coordinating Centre for Humanitarian Assistance on disaster management (AHA Centre) for successfully mobilising contributions from many ASEAN Member States and partners to undertake a humanitarian assistance mission in delivering relief supplies and aid to Myanmar despite the challenges faced during the pandemic.

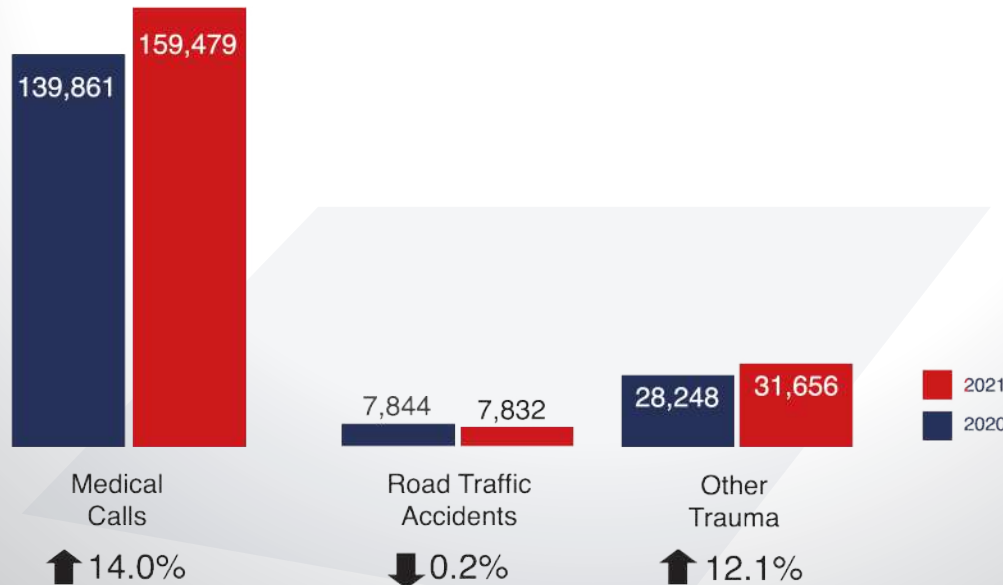

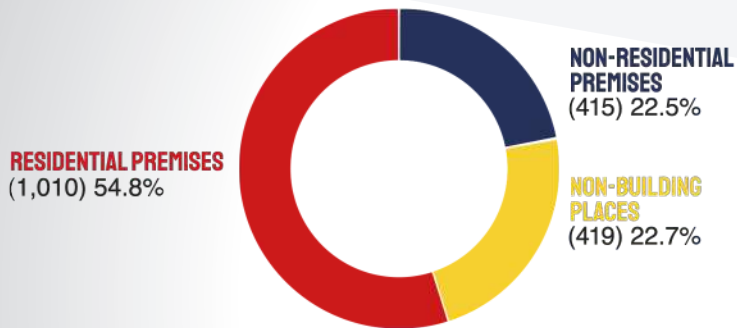

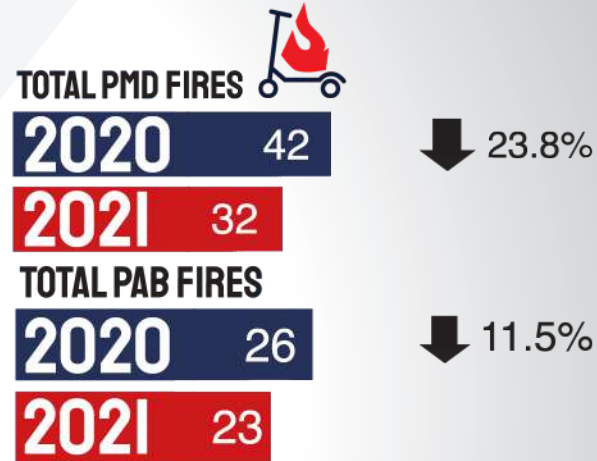
# TOTAL FIRE CALLS



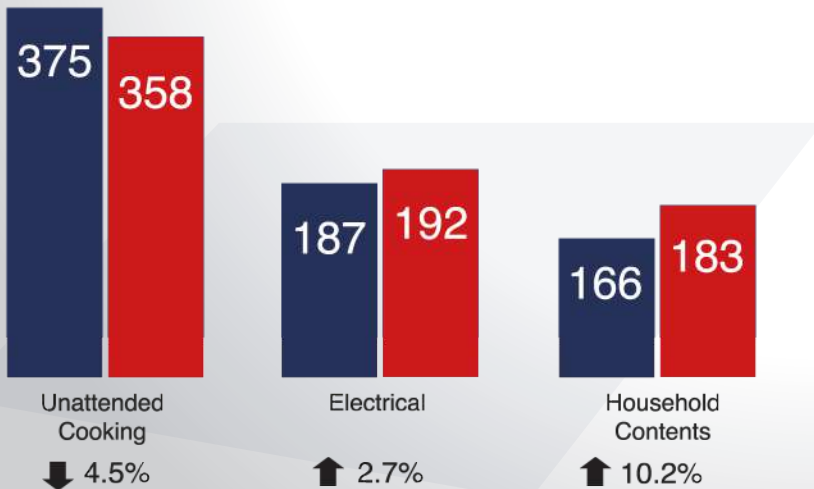
## BREAKDOWN OF FIRE CALLS



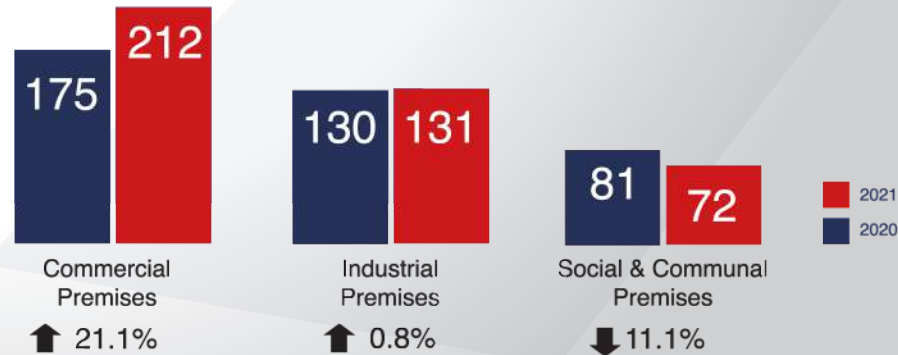
