AMENDMENT TO SUBSIDIARY LEGISLATION

Amendments to Subsidiary Legislation of the Fire Safety Act 1993

• With the amendment of the SL on 24 Nov 2023, more clarity is provided to enable FSMs to discharge their duties efficiently.

No addition of new duties.

• Clarification of existing duties by clearly indicating the next course of action for any non-compliances observed and the relevant schemes to ensure the compliance of Building Owners.

Amendments to Subsidiary Legislation of the Fire Safety Act 1993

General duties of fire safety manager

- 7.—(1) It shall be the duty of a fire safety manager appointed for any specified premises to assist the owner or occupier of the premises to
 - (a) ensure at all times that fire safety requirements contained in the Emergency Response Plan are complied with;

- (aa) where the fire safety measures and fire safety practices of the premises do not comply with the requirements of the Act
 - inform the owner or occupier of the premises (as the case may be) of the noncompliance and the need to rectify the non-compliance; and
 - record in writing details of the non-compliance and when and how the fire safety manager informed the owner or occupier, as the case may be;

(ab) where an approval of temporary change of use mentioned in regulation 21(3) of the Fire Safety (Building and Pipeline Fire Safety) Regulations (Rg 1) is issued for the premises, ensure that the owner or occupier (as the case may be) complies with any fire-safety related condition to the approval;

(ac) where the premises is a building for which a fire certificate is required under section 35 of the Act and there is no valid fire certificate for the building, inform the owner or occupier (as the case may be) that there is no such certificate;

Case Studies for False Alarm Cases

Frequent false alarm in a private residential estate

- Multiple complaints received from a condo for having frequent fire alarm activations.
- The development is around 4 years old and the residents feedback that from the onset, they had been experiencing high numbers of fire alarms activations.
- Preliminary findings revealed that the MCST had replaced several faulty detectors and it suspected acts of mischief by unhappy council members who have left.
- Conducted thorough assessment by going through the logs report for past years and identified that there was no pattern to the triggering, nor was there any specific time of the day the activations occurred.
 - > This ruled out acts of mischief.

Frequent false alarm in a private residential estate

- The report also showed that locations with replaced detectors had activations again.
 - This proved that the issue had **NOT** been resolved by the replacement of detectors.
- Identified the issue to be systemic and informed the MCST to troubleshoot the configuration of the fire protection system with the fire alarm system.
- Investigation findings revealed that during development, the configuration was not done correctly with shoddy workmanship.

Frequent false alarm in a private residential estate

Learning Points:

- 1) Thorough investigation is required to identify the root cause of a repeated incident.
- 2) To be mindful of the frequency of the alarms triggered. Cry wolf effect decreases order compliance of occupants.
- 3) To ensure all fire safety works are done with competent vendors/contractors.

False alarm in a commercial building

- Fire alarm triggered in the basement of a high-rise building due to sprinkler pump activation.
- Preliminary findings revealed water discharged from the sprinkler head with no source of fire.
- The affected zone was isolated, and the fire alarm panel was reset. Briefly, isolation was removed after changing sprinkler head.
- However, several fire safety systems were not normalised upon reset.
 - ➤ Level 19 alarm bell kept ringing
 - ➤ 3 lifts were still homing

False alarm in a commercial building

 About 30 mins later, the management responded to feedback from the occupant on the continuous fire alarm ringing at the affected floor.

Investigation findings revealed that signal relay for fire alarm bell and the lifts were

faulty.


Learning Points:

- 1) Always walk the ground to ensure all fire safety systems are fully normalised even though Fire Alarm Panel may not indicate any faults after normalising
 - Designated fire wardens to verify and to report any anomalies to FCC
- 2) FSM should be familiarised with the Emergency Response Plan (ERP).
- 3) FSM to ensure the maintenance of fire safety systems are done regularly. This would ensure the reliability of the fire safety systems during emergency.
























Frequently Asked Questions

Can I submit application using my Singpass to login?



- Only Corppass is allowed.
- Please ensure that the Corppass administrator has selected "Ministry of Trade and Industry (MTI)" and "GoBusiness" as shown below in the Corppass website (www.corppass.gov.sg).

What does the status mean in GoBusiness?



- Draft → You have not submitted the application and awaiting for you to submit.
- Submitted → You have submitted the application but with "Offline Payment" or awaiting for GIRO deduction to take place.
- Processing → Your case has reached SCDF for reviewing and approval.
- Rejected → Please check with SCDF as it may be due to Rejected Application or Rejected with no payment
- Approved → Your application has approved by SCDF.
- Outdated Draft → Your draft application has passed beyond the grace period. To apply, please resubmit a fresh application.

Why is my file not accepted?

FC Application Form Only 1 file at 7 MB or less. 1 File name must have no more than 130 characters and no spaces. Only letters (a-z), numbers (0-9), underscores (_), and hyphens (-) are allowed.

The name of file should not contain any spacing.

- X FC Renewal



How do I get started for GIRO?

Fill in Part 1 of GIRO <u>application form</u> and mail it back to them at: Ministry of Home Affairs Headquarters

How long do I need to wait for my GIRO arrangement to be effective?

GIRO application requires 21 working days to process.

I did not receive the Tax Invoice and payment has been deducted, who can I get it from?

Email to SCDF CSC@scdf.gov.sg with your Date of deduction for payment and GIRO Reference Number.

Query on CERT First aider course

Qn: MOM's Occupational First Aid (OFA) course is 3 Days and Refresher is once every 2 years; SCDF CERT First Aider Course is 1 Day. By attending OFA, is it considered as SCDF requirements being fulfilled?

Ans: Yes, as long as the courses on First aid and CPR & AED are conducted by training providers that are accredited by Singapore Resuscitation and First Aid Council (SRFAC). Please see the requirements in the next slide

Training Requirement for CERT Members

Starting from 2017, there must be a minimum of 4 trained first aiders in a CERT. The course should cover basic first aid, as well as CPR & AED. The course should cover the following topics:

Duration	Topic	Remarks
4 hours	CPR & AED	Card & certificate to be issued
4 hours	 Introduction to first aid. Management of sprains, dislocations, cuts, factures and burns. Improvised carrying techniques 	Basic first aid for CERT
1 hour	 Revision, theory & practical test 	

Any first aid training providers accredited by Singapore Resuscitation and First Aid Council (SRFAC) may conduct the CERT first aider course / basic first aid course with CPR & AED.

Accepted first aid certifications:

- WSQ Perform Workplace First Aid / Occupational First Aid with CPR and AED
- . Standard First Aid with CPR and AED /Basic First Aid with CPR and AED
- · Equivalent first aid courses that adequately covers the above topics

Non-accepted first aid certifications:

- . Basic First Aid with only CPR or AED
- Community Emergency Preparedness Programme
- First Aid orientation / introduction / awareness courses
